
Children's Church will start August 3. We have ordered a new book in our line of curriculum!

On August 10th the adult Sunday School class will begin a new series entitled <u>The World Of Biblical Israel</u>. The series begins by examining what all "Israel" connotes in the Bible: the person, the people and the place. Part of this includes challenging some of the generally held understandings of the history of ancient Israel. For instance, the Bible presents two histories on the return of the Israelites from bondage in Egypt—the most recognized one in Joshua and another in Judges. As it turns out, archaeological evidence favors the account in Judges.

But <u>The World of Biblical Israel</u> is more than a sweep of Old Testament history. It zooms in on the daily life of ordinary Israelites. From the family compounds to the battlefields and from the kitchens to the temples, it puts flesh on the bones of the biblical stories. The course will look at many aspects of daily life in ancient Israel: wedding types and implications; economics and politics of the area; local worship; lives of the rich and the poor; literacy and education; food and the family meal; and views on intermarriage.

These presentations are enriched through the use of art, relief sculptures, writing, and administrative records, both from the Israelites and from other peoples of the region to see how they viewed ancient Israel. Additional elements such as maps, family trees, and timelines provide an even more detailed visual representation of the people, their relationships, and the sites they occupied. Join us at 9:45 am on the top floor!
