NOTES FROM THE PASTOR:



I always think about Dr. Anthony L Dunnavant in February.

Tony was one of my professors at LTS, he was a noted Restoration historian, an ordained Disciples minister, and served as Dean at LTS after I graduated. I was a non-traditional student at the time (read "old") and we quickly discovered that he and I, as well as another friend and fellow student Scott, were all born in 1954, as was the stone shrine built around the original Meeting House at Cane Ridge. I have a picture of the three of us, crouched beside the cornerstone there: "1954".

Tony loved history, and was a great teacher. During my MDiv work there, I took 6 history classes – far more than needed – just to sit under his teaching. He believed strongly that those who do not know their past are doomed to repeat it. He thought it was important to know the roots of our heritage, both the Christian heritage and our own strain of belief that led us to Cane Ridge in 1801.

His tests were legendary (as in HARD). They were a combination of short answer, essay, and identification. On his tests each item in the identification section had to be answered with three salient points; and, as he pointed out often: "Old Religious Dead guy will not suffice"

I am getting ready to offer yet another Inquirer's Class for those adults who wish to know more about the Disciples as a group, FCC as a specific church, and church membership in general. I always use material that was part of an assignment for the Disciples history class I took. He said it would come in handy, and it has.

Why think about him in February? Tony passed away in February of 2001 – he was not quite 47. His funeral was a wonderful combination of laughter, tears, and to be truthful some anger at such a loss of a life so young. He is a part of the history of the denomination, and the seminary, and of my own history as well as those of many other students. From time to time I want to tell folks about him, and what he taught me. How his life and his witness made a difference in my own spiritual development and my growth as a minister.

Don't you have someone like that in your life?


