### PULPIT COMMITTEE UPDATE - as of January 25, 2016

Regional Minister, Dr. Greg Alexander, met with the Pulpit/Search committee on Tuesday, January 19. At that time he shared the protocols and processes for next steps, which are enumerated below. Information sharing, candidate portfolios, and all other pertinent information will be shared at a secure website called Basecamp. Only the committee chair will be able to print portfolios, and due to the sensitive nature of the search and call process, names and locations of candidates will not be shared. Greg explained the need for confidentiality and outlined the procedures the committee should follow during the examination of these portfolios. It makes perfect sense that the privacy of candidates must be top priority, and the committee will follow Greg's instructions to the letter. The committee requests the prayers and continued support of the congregation as we enter into this extremely critical phase of the search and call process.

- 1. Committee members will continue to meet regularly to fully discuss and prayerfully consider any portfolios that are presented on the website.
- 2. If any candidates are suggested to us or contact us outside or inside the denomination, those names will be submitted to Greg for his action and advice.
- 3. All viable and desirable candidates will initially be contacted by phone. If mutual interest exists, the committee will conduct an interview via skype. We will use a pre-determined set of questions (provided by the denomination but also including our own) that are identical for each candidate.
- 4. If mutual interest continues, a more detailed portfolio that includes samples of written sermons and prayers, along with videotaped sermons, will be examined. Following this step, the committee will use a set of discernment steps aligned with the Congregational Profile and the surveys we conducted to prayerfully consider whether the candidate is a good fit.
- 5. Again, if mutual interest continues, the committee will schedule a visit to Morehead, which may include informal meetings with the congregation in whole or in groups. Following prayerful consideration, the committee may then recommend a letter of call and will do so following the process outlined in the FCC Constitution and Bylaws.

### **MERRYMENTS: Abstain and Add**

The Lenten Season is upon us. The forty days of our Lenten journey comes very early this year, beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 10<sup>th</sup> and taking us to Easter Sunday on March 27<sup>th</sup>. Lent is different from most of our special church observances in that it offers us an extended and deliberate time to become closer to God through a variety of avenues and perspectives. During this time we are invited and encouraged to reflect more deeply; to observe more carefully, to discover more intentionally, and to pray more sincerely about our lives, our beliefs, our habits, our

sins, our faith, and our priorities. We are given the chance to spiritually challenge ourselves with new awareness and routines that help us remember and explore the very nature of our finite human existence as compared and contrasted to God's eternal and infinite love.

One of the most popular ways people observe Lent is with the discipline of abstinence, of giving up something for 40 days. There are multiple ways to do that. Statistics report the most popular item people give up for Lent is chocolate. But it's not a popularity contest. If we want to abstain from something, it should be by withholding an item which helps us realize our dependence upon God, as we deny ourselves other earthly temptations. Maybe it is chocolate. Maybe it's peanuts. Maybe it's a TV program or eating out.

Maybe our Lenten discipline is not giving up anything. Maybe it is adding something new into our daily routine: a time for meditation, emailing/texting/writing a kind note to a friend or loved one, wearing only black clothing, surprising a stranger with a random act of kindness, the list is endless as we strive to keep centered on God's grace instead of our typical self-centeredness.

This Lenten Season, we will be adding a couple of items to our worship service in such a way that gives us, the congregation, a chance to observe a Lenten discipline together. They will not be permanent changes. They are intended only to gently and temporarily change our old patterns in order to recognize how easily we can be lulled into routines. Worship routines are important and meaningful, to be sure. However, their significance can become even more powerful when we experience them in new ways.

The first change is something the church has done for many years. The "Alleluias" will go away. We will symbolically be putting them in the Alleluia Box before Ash Wednesday, and abstain from using them until Easter. In addition to that, we will be using the First Scripture as a brief lesson on Symbols of Lent, with a different scripture and symbol shared each week in worship.

Another change is more of a switch. Every week, instead of praying The Lord's Prayer after the Invocation, we will shift the prayer over to the Celebration of Communion portion of the service, and sing it as the Communion Hymn. Be assured, it is a "congregational friendly" version of The Lord's Prayer, and has a much easier melody than the one we hear sung as special solos. By connecting this prayer hymn with the symbols of the Bread and Cup of the Table, we more fully engage the saving grace offered there.

Then at the close of each worship service, we will be singing the same Congregational Benediction Hymn every week until Easter. We are already used to singing congregational benedictions on other Sundays, so this is not really "new," simply more intentional in word and tone. The Benediction will be #569 in our hymnal, "Jesus, Remember Me." It is easy to sing; only two lines long; yet will help remind us that as we are striving to remember Jesus throughout the weeks of Lent, our ever present prayer of hope is for "Jesus to remember us, when he comes into his kingdom." Look it up in the hymnal before Lent starts, and see how very simple, but profound its message is.

As we find ways to observe Lent individually, and share in ways of observing Lent corporately, may our journeys lead us in paths of righteousness and peace, of redemption and hope, and of resurrection and love in the name of our Lord, and Savior, Jesus, the Christ.

### CHOIR and BELL CHOIR NOTES

As we head into Lent – yes, it's coming up very soon (!) – I wanted to invite the congregation to reflect on The Lord's Prayer. We will be singing this prayer throughout Lent, and sometimes a new reflection can help us relate to something familiar in a new way. The following is a list of prayer suggestions from Margaret Wooding Jones of the World Prayer Centre to go along with the text of The Lord's Prayer. I hope they will aid in your Lenten journey. Our Father, who art in heaven (Pray for those you know who feel isolated and alone, who need to know the Father's love for them) hallowed be thy name (Pray for those who only use the Name(s) of God as a swear word or an expression of surprise) thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. (Pray for those in your neighborhood who do not yet know the Father's kingship in their lives. Pray for opportunities for them to see the Kingdom in action through Hope) Give us this day our daily bread (Pray for those who do not know how to cope, who are struggling with debt and for those who think that their own hard work is all they need to survive, that through Hope and acts of kindness, they will see a Father who lovingly provides for them); and forgive us our trespasses (Take time to ask God to show you if there are any sins within your area of influence (school/workplace/ neighborhood) that he is laying on your heart to confess to Him) as we forgive those who trespass against us (Pray for any relationships or issues locally where there is a need for reconciliation. Ask God if through the work and fellowship of Hope, there is more that you could do); and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. (Consider any areas of weakness that you know that you have. Ask God to give you a new Scripture to help you stand on the Truth when you are next tempted to fall short of His plan for you); For thine is the kingdom, and the Genny Jenkins, Choir Director power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen

### PULPIT COMMITTEE UPDATE - as of January 25, 2016

It is imperative that FCC Morehead be able to engage in this process in a positive way. This includes the need for the congregation to view stewardship in a somewhat different dimension. Our salary and benefits package must be competitive. We need to offer a starting salary that is reasonable but attractive. We must offer sabbatical and other professional support. In addition, we need to have a substantial budget that covers the cost of this process. Transportation for candidates, hotel accommodations and meals for candidates and other costs associated with the search will now have an impact on church finances. Please help by considering this in your church giving.

As the committee and the congregation examine why someone would consider and accept our call, we must not overlook the intangibles that FCC has to offer. Our loving support, the willingness to engage in the mission and outreach of the local and global church, and our pledge to provide a supportive spiritual environment are key determinants. But other "selling points" include the quality of life in Morehead, cost of living in the region, access to quality health care, good schools, good neighbors, and affordable housing. Additionally, we must provide an open and welcoming environment and continue to do all we can to promote the love for all humanity exemplified in the life and teachings of Jesus. Given all that, who wouldn't want to come?
