God Among Us in Ordinary Time

Advent has come and gone. Christmas has come and gone. It is now a new calendar year, although the Church liturgical year began with the first Sunday of Advent. Epiphany has come and gone, as well as, the celebration of Jesus' baptism. We now find ourselves in a period of time that goes by several names. Sometimes this may be confusing. At times, I know it has been for me.

Season of Epiphany. Epiphanytide. Ordinary Time. For example, the first Sunday in February this

year is the Fourth Sunday After the Epiphany or the Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time. The season or time begins with Epiphany, January 6th, and ends the day before Ash Wednesday. It's the time in the church year when we do not focus on a particular event. That is, we do not celebrate any events related to Christmas or Easter. The Revised Common Lectionary uses these terms in providing scripture readings for the counting time of growth—spiritual growth.

Spotlighting Gateway Baskets


Now on to a new year. February through October we furnish a basket for folks transitioning from the Gateway Shelter to a home. These are sometimes singles, but many are families with children and jobs. The baskets contain new items such as sheets, towels, rugs, pots, dishes, microwave, etc. The average cost per basket is \$300.

Gateway Shelter serves five counties and transitions 6-10 households per month. The staff does follow ups with these families and the success rate is 90%. What a tremendous asset this agency is to our community.

We have had sign ups for the baskets and all slots are full. If you would like to still help out with this or other projects, contact any of the Outreach Committee members. There is no end to the assistance we can give.




Living Faith, by Jimmy Carter (Christian Living). For almost three decades, President Carter has regularly spent part of each Sunday



reading from scripture and sharing his personal faith with neighbors, friends, and visitors at his Baptist church in Plains, Georgia. In *Living Faith*, he draws on this experience, exploring the values closest to his heart and the personal beliefs that have nurtured and sustained him. For President Carter, faith finds its deepest expression in a life of compassion, reconciliation, and service to others. Living Faith is filled with stories of people whose lives have touched hissome from the world stage, more from modest walks of life. We see how President Carter

learned about other faiths from Prime Minister Menachim Begin and President Anwar Sadat; learned a lesson in forgiveness from a clash with commentator George Will; how he was inspired by the simple theology of preacher Ely Cruz, "Love God and the person in front of you"; and how the cheerful strength of family friend Annie Mae Rhodes taught him the meaning of "patient faith." Rooted in scripture and infused with a vision of how a dynamic faith can enrich our public and private lives, this is the most personal book yet by one of our most admired Americans—a warmly inspirational volume to give and to share.



The Prayer that Changes Everything: The Hidden Power of Praising God, by Stormie Omartian (Spiritual Growth). Stormie Omartian inspires readers to open their lives to the prayer that changes everything—the prayer of praise to God. This bestselling look at prayer and worship has a fresh cover for a new audience. Intimate conversations with God often focus on immediate needs, concern for others, and direction regarding His will, but praise requires believers to look beyond themselves and their circumstances and place their attention solely on God. Stormie shares personal stories, biblical truths, and practical guiding principles to reveal the wonders that take place when Christians offer praise in the middle of difficulties, sorrow, fear, and, yes, abundance and joy. Study questions are incorporated into each chapter so that readers receive the opportunity to put what they learn into practice. The

Prayer That Changes Everything helps them uncover the amazing power, benefit, and freedom that can be found in praising God.



Each Kindness, by Jacqueline Woodson and illustrated by E.B. Lewis (Focus on Children and Youth). This unforgettable book is written and illustrated by the award-winning team that created *The Other Side* and the Caldecott Honor winner *Coming On Home Soon*. With its powerful anti-bullying message and striking art, it will resonate with readers long after they've put it down. Chloe and her friends won't play with the new girl, Maya. Every time Maya tries to join Chloe and her friends, they reject her. Eventually Maya stops coming to school. When Chloe's teacher gives a lesson about how even small acts of kindness can change the world, Chloe is stung by the lost opportunity for friendship, and thinks about how much better it could have been if she'd shown a little kindness toward Maya.

David Toole, Associate Dean of Duke Divinity School, provides this insight into this time: "Ordinary time is 'ordinary' in part because of what it is not: It is not Advent or Christmas or Lent or Easter. It is not ... the time during which the church is engaged in preparations for, or celebrations of, the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Ordinary Time is also ordinary because of what it is: ... the season that makes up most of our time ... every year, depending on the dates of Epiphany and Easter. It is a time during which we are called ... to follow Jesus, and in following him, to listen to him. ... No bright stars. No earthquakes. Just a voice that strikes our ear amid the ordinariness of our lives and announces that God is among us." Blessed be your Ordinary Time!



Saint Valentine (Italian: San Valentino, Latin: Valentinus) was a widely recognized 3rd-century Roman saint, commemorated in Christianity on February 14. From the High Middle Ages his Saints' Day is associated with a tradition of courtly love. There

are two different Saints' Lives for a St Valentine on February 14, but they are probably the same man. Saint Valentine was a clergyman – either a priest or a bishop – in the Roman Empire who ministered to persecuted Christians. He was martyred and his body buried at a Christian cemetery on the Via Flaminia close to the Ponte Milvio to the north of Rome, on February 14, which has been observed as the Feast of Saint Valentine (Saint Valentine's Day) since 496 AD.
