Remember that this coming Sunday – January 4th – we will have baskets at each door containing our 2015 Epiphany Stars. These are for everyone who wishes to have one; they are just star shaped piece of brightly colored paper with a word printed on it. As you help yourselves to a star gift (without looking—just reach in and grab!), the significance is not lost. In this moment, you are not asked to give; you are invited to receive. This is a way to remind us that this is always the order of things in God's realm—God always gives first, and then we are invited to respond with our gifts and ourselves. Please ponder what significance this word might have in your life, and how God might be speaking to you through that simple message. Many of you have mentioned placing the star in a significant place – on your computer, in your Bible, or on your refrigerator – to remind you of that gift each and every day.
