### THE PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

The first Sunday in June begins this year with Pentecost Sunday. The name comes from the Greek word Pentēkostē [hēmera], "[the] fiftieth [day]". It is celebrated on the 50<sup>th</sup> day after Easter Sunday (including Easter). It marks the day in our Biblical church history when the disciples received "the Advocate" that Jesus had promised to be with us after he leaves the earth. Acts 2:1–2, "And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting."

This day has been referred to as the "Birthday of the Church" because after they received the Holy Spirit and were able to understand and share the truth of Christ, they immediately started sharing what they knew, creating communities where there was once only a Jesus Movement. After this experience the 3 aspects of God were in play – like the missing piece of the puzzle. Pentecost is celebrated most often with the color red. The parametrs on the altar, the stole of the Pastor, and often congregant wear red to celebrate this day!

The Sunday following Pentecost is Trinity Sunday, a day to contemplate what "God in 3 persons" is all about. And Trinity Sunday is, perhaps oddly enough, one of my favorite days. It is all about wholeness to me!

The next Sunday in June is Father's Day! Just as Mother's Day was a day not just to celebrate Motherhood, but the responsibility to nurture and care for God's creations that people of all genders have; Father's Day is a calling to reexamine our gender roles.



June is the month of getting the church *into* a period of working on our faith goals, through the groundwork we have placed through the first half of the Church Year. We will be in Ordinary time until Advent! But this does not mean we stop setting new goals and thinking about how we can best serve the church. This means if we have taken our faith seriously, we have the motivation, joy and drive to be with each other, grow in faith, and the hope to live for being God's instruments to create peace and justice! So – buckle up folks, we could be in for a bumpy ride!

### MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Earlier today I was doing some class preparation for Sunday School. In a couple of weeks we will be looking at Ulrich Zwingli and I decided that for our supplementary reading we would look at a chapter with one of my all-time-favorite book chapter titles, "Some Middle-Aged Men and a Sausage Supper."

The short version is this: Zwingli had been busy preaching at church that people's consciences must be guided by the Bible and not tradition. So Lent rolled around and in defiance of the tradition that required abstinence from meat for Lent, one of the guys in the congregation had a big bratwurst feast. At least, that's how I've already interpreted it because I

really love bratwurst. Any-hoo, some people in his congregation became really upset and there was drama in the congregation so Zwingli felt like he had to give a sermon about the situation. And you already know what he said. He basically said that some people feel like it's okay to eat meat during Lent. Other people don't feel like it's okay to eat meat during Lent. Whew! Just love each other and get on with it!

We don't have any specific instructions about bratwurst, or Lent, or fasting as a form of worship, but we do have pretty specific instructions about loving each other. Zwingli was a pretty smart guy so I don't have anything to add.

### **SPIRIT**

The word *spirit* has come to mean something pale and shapeless, like an unmade bed. School spirit, the American spirit, the Christmas spirit, the spirit of '76, the Holy Spirit each of these points to something you know is supposed to get you to your feet cheering but which you somehow can't rise to. The adjective *spiritual* has become downright offensive. If somebody recommends a person as spiritual you tend to avoid him, and usually with good reason. *Inspiring* is even worse. *Inspirational* is worse still. Inspirational books are invariably for the birds.

Like its counterparts in Hebrew and Greek, the Latin word *spiritus* originally meant *breath* (as in expire, respiratory, etc.), and breath is what you have when you're alive and don't have when you're dead. Thus spirit = breath = life, the aliveness and power of your life, and to speak of a man's spirit (or soul) is to speak of the power of life that is in him. When the spirit of a man is unusually strong, the life in him unusually alive, he can breathe it out into other lives, become literally in-spiring.

Spirit is highly contagious. When a man is very excited, very happy, very sad, you can catch it from him as easily as measles or a yawn. You can catch it from what he says or from what he does or just from what happens to the air of a room when he enters it without saying or doing anything. Groups of men also have a spirit, as anybody can testify who has ever been caught up in the spirit of a football game, a political rally, or a lynch mob. Spirit can be good or bad, healing or destructive. Spirit can be transmitted across great distances of time and space. For better or worse, you can catch the spirit of men long dead (Socrates or the Marquis de Sade), of men whose faces you have never seen and whose languages you cannot speak.

God also has a spirit - is Spirit, says the Apostle John (4:24). Thus God is the power of the power of life itself, has breathed and continues to breathe himself into his creation. In-spires it. The spirit of God, Holy Spirit, Holy Ghost, is highly contagious. When Peter and his friends were caught up in it at Jerusalem on Pentecost, everybody thought they were drunk even though the sun wasn't yet over the yardarm (Acts 2). They were.

### The Christian Holiday of Pentecost

The Christian holiday of Pentecost is celebrated 50 (101-51) days from Easter Sunday, counting inclusive of Easter Sunday itself, i. e. 49 days or 7 weeks *after* Easter Sunday Therefore it always occurs on a Sunday. It is also the tenth day after Ascension

Thursday, which itself is 40 days from Easter, counting inclusive of Easter Sunday itself. The Christian Pentecost is based on the New Testament, where it refers to the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the tApostles and other followers of Jesus Christ, as described in the Acts of the Apostles 2:1–31. According to Luke 22:12–13, the descent of the Holy Spirit occurred while the Apostles were celebrating the Jewish day of Shavuot, the Feast of Weeks, a prominent feast in the calendar of ancient Israel celebrating the giving of the Law to Moses at Sinai. In the Christian liturgical year it became a feast commemorating what is described by some Christians as the "Birthday of the Church."
