

"You do have your whole life in front of you,' said Jacob, "and yet life is an experience not only of breadth, but of depth. As you grow older, the game of life goes inside, making room for memory. The interior life is no less real, and in some ways more private, more 'yours."

"But," said the young man, "what do you think my grandfather spends so much time thinking about?"

"Maybe he is thinking about you."

"About me?"

"Yes," said Jacob. "Maybe he's worried that his grandson is living only on the surface of life, and he wonders when you'll come inside."

Spirituality is bi-directional. Most certainly, spirituality looks 'up' to our God, but authentic spirituality invites – no, demands – we journey within, to the inside, and consider the possibility of doing some divine remodeling. **SELAH** (stop and think about it).



FCC Work Day

Saturday June 2, 2018

Inside jobs:

- -Dust or wipe down all window sills/ledges in the sanctuary
- -Dust or wipe down all window sills/ledges in the office, Sunday School rooms, etc.
- -Dust bell and areas around chancel
- -Dust lower metal rail of stair balusters
- -Vacuum around organist's seat
- -Wipe radiator tops
- -Clean baseboards
- -Clean inside of windows in office, Sunday School rooms, etc.
- -Clean inside of towel holder trays in restrooms
- -Clean restroom sinks
- -Mop or wet Swiffer restroom floors

Outside jobs:

- -Spray weeds between parking lot curb and pavement
- -Pull vines from planter areas
- -Pull grass and weeds from planter areas
- -Sweep or blow sand and grit from concrete area alongside church
- -Gently shape bushes in front of church
- -Remove Virginia Creeper vines on left front of church
- -Cut back or trim the bush at the edge of labyrinth toward intersection
- -Rake and level pea gravel in labyrinth
- -Remove holly tree and vines on north side or church (careful, some vines may be poison ivy)

It is best to bring your own equipment or supplies sice we may not have many of them (or can't find them if we do). It is also wise to have gloves, long sleeves if outside, etc.)
