### CHOIR AND BELLS

This past Christmas, I wanted to do a more traditional lessons and carols instead of a Christmas cantata. It also seems sometimes that the schedules in December are so full for our singers that working on a larger work is more difficult. We will have, in the choir, several guests who will be joining us to sing this lovely choral work which will be integrated into the service.


