Feldenkrais: Doing Gratitude Monday November 4, 11, 18 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Team taught by Maggie Miles and Ned Breschel

Authentic gratitude is a spiritual practice we do, not something we find. It is also a habit we can learn. In three class sessions, we'll use gentle, meditative movement as the context for exploring how to:

- identify negative habits that pull us down
- discover new possibilities for transformed action, and
- shift to where being and doing gratitude come easily.

Class members will be encouraged to do some simple exercises during the week, such as keeping a gratitude journal or using a gratitude calendar. To reinforce the intentionality.
