NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

It's that time of year again. The air is crisp, the leaves are turning, the nights start sooner, the sweatshirts come out of storage. Andy Williams may have thought Christmas was the most wonderful time of the year; for me, it's autumn.

There are a few songs about the fall ("Autumn Leaves", "October Road", "Autumn in New York"), but it's not as heralded as other seasons. In our part of the country, the fall comes with the very physical reminder that the world is cyclic. It brings to mind the words of the Preacher in Ecclesiastes: *To everything there is a season*... Some folks feel like autumn comes with a stark reminder of death and dying, of aging and withering. I would like to counter that it comes with an eternal promise of rest and rejuvenation. For many parts of the world, autumn is a time for plants to absorb nutrients and rest, for animals to burrow in, for added hours of starlight.

I suppose – as with so much of life – it comes down to choice. To how we choose to view whatever season of life we're in. I see young people who are wishing their todays away in order to get on to tomorrow. I see older people (and I include my own age in that!) who wish to be in their yesterdays rather than see who they can be today. Is there anything sadder than a wasted day? Especially when the Lord God gives them to us each 24 hours as a place of beginning again?

Don't try to fast forward through your life. Don't try to hit 'pause' and stay long past where you should be. Every time you see a squirrel with an acorn, a brilliantly orange leaf, a wisp of smoke from a chimney - pause and say 'thank you for right now' to the Giver of All Life.
