



NOTES FROM THE PASTOR:

As I write this, it is the autumnal equinox (September 23rd). To my way of thinking, fall is a better time of year to make resolutions than January; there is something about the combination of back to school (new crayons, clean paper, freshly sharpened pencils) and a crisp morning that encourages me to start new habits or to discontinue old ones. So in that spirit....

- Now might be a good time to pick out a new devotional book, or to establish a different pattern of centering time with God. There are many wonderful books on the market; don't settle for something light, but look for an author that will challenge you and direct you in new ways of thought and growth.
- 2014-2015 calendars are now for sale. Here's a thought: why not put church events in your calendar like you do with school, work, or sport events? We make time for what is important.
- Don't overload yourself with 'betterment' issues. Think of at least one practice you can begin that will make a difference in someone else's life: send out a card a week; bake a small batch of muffins to take to someone homebound; show up early for church and spend time talking with those around you; when you are at the grocery, pick up something for the Food Pantry.
- SLOW DOWN. Around here we encourage a crock-pot approach to establishing our relationship with God. Be mindful, and make mindfulness a habit. Some examples our friend Thich Nhat Hanh suggests include: seeing the brake lights on the car in front of you as a reminder to slow down and breathe; washing the dishes with a heart full of gratitude for food to eat and a prayer for those who don't have enough; not rushing through your meal, but be aware of how each bite tastes and smells and nourishes you.
- Block out ten minutes a day I know, I know, you say you can't find ten minutes. But you can if you want to. Block out ten minutes: spend 5 minutes talking with God. Spend the next 5 listening to God.
- This time of year we are not as bombarded with events and 'stuff' as we are after Christmas; chances are good that if we seek to make these changes now, they will have helped change us enough so that by Advent we may be in a better place in our relationship with God, and in our own life. So, Happy New Year!!
