This past Sunday night there was a spectacular Lunar Eclipse. Some the pictures of it were incredible. News and weather programs, with access to powerful cameras set up in perfect locations, covered the eclipse from start to finish. Professional and amateur photographers tried to capture the event as it progressed, posting pictures on Facebook or in newspapers for all to see.

Depending on where these photos were taken, the eclipse took on a bit of a different look. The quality and/or visibility of the event were affected depending on the local weather at any given site. The moon's transition from light, to dark, back to light was one event, yet captured not only in various stages, but also under variable conditions.

Some of us may have excitedly watched the whole event. Some of us may have been frustrated by cloud cover or other obstructed views. Some of us may have forgotten all about it, gone to bed, and totally missed it.

First Christian is going through its own "Lunar Eclipse" as we move through this interim time of transition. Depending on where each of us might be standing at any given moment, this "eclipse" looks a little bit different. Not only is it possible for our view to be different from the person who sits next to us in the pew every Sunday morning, we, ourselves might even have several different views of the events as they are unfolding.

Regardless of, and because of, "where" we are in this eclipse as individuals, may we come together as a congregation to celebrate the opportunity and beauty this "eclipse" brings to us, strengthen each other through its shadows and uncertainties, and prayerfully seek the new light of mission and ministry it will bring when it is complete.
