#### THE PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

#### Bread - the truth and Euphemism for so much more

It can mean exactly what western culture has associated with it for decades ~ that glorious stuff made with flour and yeast and more which we slice and make sandwiches with, or toast and put butter on. And the varieties of this kind of bread! We have white, and wheat, and rye, and pumpernickel and, and, and! We can also include muffins, and biscuits in this category, for leavening includes baking powder.

And yet, in addition to the yeast loaves, we have discovered so many varieties of what we may refer to as bread. Unleavened bread is what was made famous by the exodus – bread one can make quickly for emergency travels, not requiring a starter or yeast – just oil and flour and water and go! And this bread also comes in a variety of shapes and sizes ~ like Matza, Pita, Naan, Tortilla, Rotli! Each culture seems to have their own contribution to feed their people, and we have shared these discoveries often with each other.

Bread comes in all shapes and tastes and the variety is just such a joy and a blessing for us all! It also unites us in wonder filled ways. Who recalls their first experience of eating a bread from another culture? Wasn't it exotic? I recall my first experience with Naan – that bread from Indian, which when fried, fluffs up like a balloon! And when I tore it open the steam wafted out of it visually and the smell was amazing! It was as if part of India had been transported into my present moment far from the continent from whence it derived! Our fiscal year theme at FCC is "Bread for All." And this means so much more than making sure everyone has food, but that is an

important part of it. Bread for all means appreciating the breads and the peoples which have been brought to this world – and even celebrating the variety of life this world has brought with it. But none of us can overlook or underestimate the comparison to the Lord's Table, where Jesus shared with us that he is the "Bread of the World, in mercy broken." Bread for all is Christ for all, a missionary message. Christ for all means mercy and love and grace for all, where nothing can separate us from the power that is our one God, creator of heaven and earth. And we are called to provide bread, and grace, and love and mercy and hope for all, without stopping to ask if the other person is worthy. We are God's leaven in this world, and leaven does not chose where it will grow, it grows where it is celebrated. And this is our goal for FCC Morehead, that we be and do and give and grow in Christ's name. Bread for all! In Joy, Rev. Lisa


