#### -NOTES FROM THE PASTOR-

It is 6 in the morning. I have just finished reading the morning news. Dear me. In an information overload sort of world, it can be easy to feel overwhelmed; to despair of anything - at all - going right. Save of course the cute kitten who chases the laser. (Which in truth never cheers me up anyway.) It seems to me that we have choices in our response to the morning news.

We can choose to ignore it all. Keep our heads in the sand. I can't really see that as a viable option; not if we are to be thinking, voting, caring members of this world.

We can listen to all of it, all the time ("I'm a news junkie", some folks will tell me. "I have CNN on 24/7"). Seems to me as if that would cause us to become inured to it, as if it is white noise, or to just fall on the floor in a heap of tears.

There is a balance, I think. I would suggest the following:

+Find 2 or 3 sources you trust. I will not get into the sources themselves, but I would encourage you to listen to at least 1 source that goes slightly away from your personal viewpoint. Make sure your sources deal with a world outside of Rowan County, or even this country.

+Try to see that they are indeed NEWS sources, versus those venues that need to fill their own feed. For instance - and I am not making judgments about these people - the Kardashians are NOT news. No matter what others tell you.

+Then set a time in your day when you can really concentrate, and truly pay attention. If you don't understand a subject, make sure you educate yourself on it. The time itself may vary from person to person - 15 minutes, 30 minutes, 60 minutes.

+THEN WALK AWAY. Unless there is a true crisis, chances are you will be listening to a loop.

+And here is the step we need to add: DO SOMETHING ABOUT WHAT YOU HEARD OR READ. And going 'tut-tut, the world is going to hell in a handbasket' does not count. Pray. Give of yourself. Write a check. Join an organization. Educate yourself. Make your words positive ones. Don't be someone who sends out ugly thoughts or petty opinions. If you can't say something nice - think about being quiet, or offering kind words. Make sure you are a part of the solution. We can't change the world all by ourselves, but together we can make it better for all. Jesus told his followers that it is not enough to not do bad things - <u>we are to do good and lov-ing things.</u> We are a part of the body of Christ; even with what we read in the news, we already know that Love Wins. Let's act as if we believe it.
