



incompleteness, when a space created in us that cries out to be filled. Goodbyes are any of those times when we find ourselves without a someone or a something that has given our life meaning and value, when a dimension of our life seems to be out of place or unfulfilled. Goodbyes are all of those experiences that leave us with a hollow feeling someplace deep inside" (J. Rupp, Praying our Goodbyes. 26).

I don't do "goodbyes" very well. Never have; probably never will. And as I grow older, goodbyes have begun to feel more and more like some dreaded disease! And yet, goodbyes are a part of the human condition. They are inescapable. Sometimes we get to choose the 'when' and 'where' of the goodbye. At other times they choose us. But make no mistake about it, goodbyes are always difficult. They are the high cost of being human.

My history tells me that at times of intense emotional turmoil, solace is best found in my head. So, it's very easy for me to theorize, intellectualize or rationalize. I too often retreat to cerebral functioning to tell me that everything is going to be okay. Therefore, I do find comfort in finding value in learning to appropriately say goodbye. I reflect, deeply reflect, on my belief that a proper goodbye teaches me something significant about myself and draws me nearer to God. Furthermore, a proper goodbye is mandated if I am to fully enter life's next grand adventure. Imagine that...I must say goodbye before saying "hello!"

But it still hurts!

So maybe I just need to let my heart say what it desires to say. And that would be that I love each of you dearly. You have privileged me to serve you, fill your pulpit, pray with you, bury your loved ones, share meals with you, fellowship and laugh together. The past twenty months – almost 25 if you count my first two stints in Morehead – have been among the most enjoyable and fun-filled times of more than three decades in ministry. You are a great people and loving congregation, thoroughly devoted to God's enterprise in your community and our world. Thank you for sharing your life and ministry with me. Mere words will never be able to convey my gratitude and thanksgiving.

In closing, let me again share Sister Rupp's wise words: "When we learn how to say goodbye we truly learn how to say to ourselves and to others: Go, God be with you. I entrust you to God. The God of strength, courage, comfort, hope, and love is with you. The God who promises to wipe away all tears will hold you close and will fill your emptiness" (Rupp, Praying Our Goodbyes, 30).

So let us now pass the peace of Christ and go with God. Shalom.



Genny Jenkins a guest harpist (date TBA).






To Kill a Mockingbird, by Harper Lee (Focus on Children and Youth).
