

Notes from Pastor Nancy

REV. NANCY GOWLER

In the summer of 2007 as I was beginning my first sabbatical, I wandered into our local Borders bookstore, and stumbled across a book that would shape my sabbatical time more than any other: How to Be Idle: a Loafer's Manifesto by Tom Hodgkinson, founding editor of The Idler magazine. My sabbatical was funded by a generous Lily Foundation clergy grant which encourages clergy to seek rest and renewal. I had a plan, a calendar, and a healthy budget for my three months off. However, there was still that nagging voice in the back of my head, whispering that I must make this sabbatical "productive." I had internalized the judgement that simply resting and loafing about doing things which brought me joy was not a worthy endeavor in and of itself. Hodgkinson helped me silence that voice, for a few months.

It remains one of the books I regularly recommend to others.

The book slowly ambles its way through the hours of a day, inviting the reader to set aside the imperialistic metaphor "time is money," and to ask questions about leisure, health, happiness, and well-being. Beginning with the tyranny of the alarm clock, Hodgkinson finds inspiration from the great slackers of the past, including Oscar Wilde, Robert Louis Stevenson, Samuel Johnson, Robert Burns and so many more. He writes with joy and humor, elevating the importance of tea time, afternoon walks, fishing, and late night conversations. The entire Idler project is a much needed anecdote to Benjamin Franklin's unfortunately popular aphorism, early to bed and early to rise, "makes a man healthy, wealthy, and wise."

As I write this, it seems the long days of summer have already arrived. Can they be a time of renewal for us? Could the summer of '23 be a chance to slow down, take a much needed break, and perhaps even recalibrate the pace of our lives?



What if this summer wasn't productive in the least bit, but rather unfolded as a time filled with rest, renewal, relationships, pleasure, and yes, even idleness?

We could call this a Sabbath summer, and tap into the rich traditions of regular rest in our Scriptures. As Abraham Heschel wrote, "Man is not a beast of burden, and the Sabbath is not for the purpose of enhancing the efficiency of his work." Rest is a gift for us. We could remind ourselves that God created Sabbath and blessed it, the seventh day of Creation.

Let's give it a try, shall we? Let's be inspired by the wisdom of Ferris Bueller, "The question isn't, 'What are we going to do?" The question is, 'What aren't we going to do?"


