### Notes from Pastor Nancy Rev. Nancy Gowler

One of the wonderful benefits of our Lenten devotional, *The Poetry of Lent*, has been the opportunity to break open again Mary Oliver's amazing collection of poetry, *Devotions*. As much as I love her way with words, I had forgotten that so many of her moving reflections are drawn from her observations of birds. Here's one such gem, from her poem, "I Happened to be Standing."

> "...While I was thinking this I happened to be standing just outside my door, with my notebook open, which is the way I begin every morning. Then a wren in the privet began to sing.

He was positively drenched in enthusiasm, I don't know why. And yet, why not.

I wouldn't persuade you from whatever you believe or whatever you don't. That's your business. But I thought, of the wren's singing, what could this be if it isn't a prayer? So I just listened, my pen in the air."

Just listen. Part of the experience of birding is intentionally slowing down, listening for the songs and sounds of the birds, and learning to distinguish the songs from one another. Birding takes time and attention. It opens us up to focusing on something other than ourselves, which seems a perfect spiritual practice for Lent.

I've downloaded on my phone the app, Merlin, which is a bird identification app developed by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. Each morning I open the app to help identify the birds who sing in my backyard. There are the usual birds—cardinals, crows, blue jays, swallows, robins, finches, doves, and grackles. Their songs are vibrant and loud. Recently Canadian geese are beginning to make their way back home. This morning off in the distance I could hear the echoing drums of a downy woodpecker, busy working to find breakfast. It was glorious!

The morning air is filled with prayers...if we just stop and listen.



# Helping a New Family to Morehead



# **FCC ENDOWMENT FUNDS**

**ENDOWMENT FUNDS** are growing resources that extend the ministries of our congregation. Endowment funds are invested through The Christian Church Foundation, and the income is used annually.

The **LIVING MEMORIAL FUND** was created by forward thinking FCC members. The principal may grow, but is not to be used. The major restriction is that income may not be used for the operating budget.

The **INEZ FAITH HUMPHREY FUND** began in the 1990s as a response to trends within the larger church, particularly declining numbers of major donors to church ministries. Under the guidance of Rev. Harold Tackett, the initial seed money for this fund was the sale of the church's parsonage. Over time larger gifts were added to this vital fund. This fund exists to help us navigate lean times. There are no restrictions on the fund, and the FCC board prayerfully approaches the use of the generated income.

The **YOUTH FUND** was established through the generosity of a single donor to support the education and growth of youth in the church.

For youth who completed grades 9-12 in 2024. We offer housing that accommodates any camper's gender identity. These camps also feature a closing night formal banquet, so campers should pack a nice outfit.

#### **Eighters Camp**

For youth who completed grade 8 in 2024. We offer housing that accommodates any camper's gender identity. Eighters specializes in human sexuality and spirituality. The Christian Church in Kentucky partners with *Just Say Know Ministries, justsayknowministry.com.* for this camp.

#### Chi Rho Camps I & 2

For youth who completed grades 6-8 in 2024. We offer housing that accommodates any camper's gender identity.

#### Junior Camp

For youth who completed grades 4-5 in 2024.

#### Mini Camp

For youth that completed grades 2\*-3 in 2024.

#### Camps 101A & B

For youth that completed grades  $K-2^*$  in 2024. These camps are designed to orient children to the camping experience. It

also provides an opportunity for them to share the adventure with a trusted friend. Each camper must be accompanied by a parent, grandparent, guardian, or other adult aged 21 or older. Like the camper, the accompanying adult needs to fully register for the camp. 101A is a weekend long, sleepover camp. 101B is a single day but does include all the activities of the overnight camp.

Come out and CELEBRATE 150 years of Disciples Women's Ministry!!!


