Notes From Pastor Nancy

History is not a burden on the memory but an illumination of the soul.

Dear Disciples,

Much of pastoral ministry involves not speaking, but listening. A new minister slowly learns the stories of their congregation, both individual stories and the collective history of that faith community. Listening takes time and intentionality. As relationships deepen, the opportunities for sharing significant and personal experiences grows.

A few months ago I shared some of what I've been learning about FCC Morehead, gleaned from conversations and practices. I listed the core values I've see in this faith community: communion, compassion, education, beauty, Creation, hospitality, community, history, and practicality.

It's an incomplete list, I know. Still I hope we can continue the conversation on these core values. I'd love to see where our lists overlap and what you know of this congregation that I have yet to learn.

Let me say a bit more about one of those core values: history. I am mindful of the rich tradition of this congregation, under the direction of Frank C. Button its joint history with the founding of the Morehead Normal School, now Morehead State University. The very foundation of the church building rests upon the ground of its predecessor, the Union Church, which was built at the encouragement Col. John Hargis, founder of Morehead (see Anne Buckner's column for more information about Col. Hargis).

Those two parts of our congregation's history reveal the threads of ministry which continue to this day: our ongoing commitment to education and our dedication to ecumenism. It is, borrowing the words of Lord Acton, "an illumination of the soul" of this congregation.

An exploration of one's history also calls us to reflection, and at times repentance. Our ancestors, both personal and corporate, were human beings like us, sometimes inspiring, at other points most fallible. Engaging in history requires much of us, to be willing to face uncomfortable facts and to learn what those parts of our history reveal about ourselves. Our congregation's history is no exception. The first financial supporter of the founding of the Normal School and of the Christian Church in Morehead was William Temple Withers, a former Confederate general and slaveowner, and also a prominent Lexington philanthropist and supporter within Christian Church circles. His name is included in one of our stained glass windows. History is complicated because human beings are complicated.

We are beginning our worship services with an acknowledgement of the land, a public recognition of the stories of this place before us, of the people who lived on this land, loved it, cared for it, and who were forcibly displaced from their lands. That story is part of the history of the American church, too, and of ours as members of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). It's a history which may make us uncomfortable, which challenges the narratives our ancestors told about themselves. Learning about the Doctrine of Discovery, the role that Christian churches played in the forced removal and the intentional erasure of indigenous culture and practices, enables us to tell our own stories with more honesty and humility. And it can change the ways in which we engage in ministry today, as we learn from the mistakes of the past and see how those historic decisions still affect the present day.


Our histories are a mix of cherished stories and of regrets. I'm grateful that this congregation is committed to being faithful storytellers who both inspire and who don't flinch at the painful chapters of the past.

Our Beginnings—A History and Comment

First Christian Church by Anne Reynolds Buckner

Founding of Morehead and Morehead Normal School Rowan County Kentucky

It is believed that Rowan County was first explored in 1773 by a party of surveyors from Pennsylvania. The first settlement was established in Farmers, a town 10 miles west of Morehead. The population rapidly increased due to its fertile farming land and proximity to water sources. Additional settlers came to Rowan County from Virginia in the late 18th century after being awarded land grants at the end of the American Revolutionary War. Clearfield was the second settlement established in the county, being colonized by a Virginia aristocrat named Dixon Clack in the early 1800s. It accommodated the first

sawmill in the county. In 1854 Morehead became the third community to be settled in the area. Colonel John Louis Hargis founded the city after purchasing the land in the county, naming it after Governor James Morehead. Rowan County came into existence in 1856, seceding from Morgan and Fleming County. It was divided into four districts with Morehead being declared the county seat.

Prior to moving to Morehead, Col. Hargis had established a strong character, marked spirit and independence, and held state positions with the leading men of his day and time. He represented the counties of Breathitt and Morgan as a member of the Constructional Congress in 1849 when the state was changed to a commonwealth. Col Hargis was an assistant U. S. records as Colonel John Louis Hargis or "Bally John". He was a

Marshall in 1850. He is referred to in records as Colonel John Louis Hargis or "Bally John". He was a member of the convention which framed the present Constitution of Kentucky. It was divided into four districts with Morehead being declared the county seat. When he moved to Morehead he brought with him his wife and two sons, Kenaz F. Hargis and Thomas Frazier. He gave the land on which the Union Church was built, now First Christian Church, DOC. His funeral was held in the Union Church. Col. John Hargis is honored and memorialized with a Historical Marker, which is located on the side of the Rowan County Arts Center Building, recognizing him as a Rowan County Pioneer, Framer of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Morehead's First Postmaster, lawyer, storekeeper and having stepped off the land for Morehead's first Courthouse Square in 1856.
