Notes From Pastor Nancy p1

In the midst of all of this uncertainty, as we grieve experiences and people we miss, even as we struggle with resentment or anger, I encourage you to be kind to yourself. Allow yourself to feel whatever emotions come to you. There is no one right way to live through a pandemic.

Each Thursday night vespers includes two readings: one from Mark's gospel and also a psalm. The Psalms are a gift to us—in it we are given the heights and the depths of human emotions. Nothing is off limits. We hear the rawness of personal pain and tragedy. The psalmist gives voice to despair and loneliness.

I am twisted, I am all bent.

All day long I go about gloomy. (Ps. 38:7)

At times the honesty can take us aback. (Ps. 137:9 is a horrific example.) For me it bears witness to the wideness of God's embrace. There is no emotion we can experience that would make God turn away. The psalmist offers words of soaring praise and joy alongside of the darkness of pain and suffering. It is an unflinching portrayal of human living with no judgement or rejection.

Through all its pages the psalms provide a glimpse of a faith forged in the messiness of life. Faith that doesn't require a forced optimism or demand we live with false smile on our faces. So give yourself some space...and some grace, too. These days of pandemic may linger, but God's steadfast love endures forever. (Ps. 136)

Be well. Be kind.

And always be the church where you are.

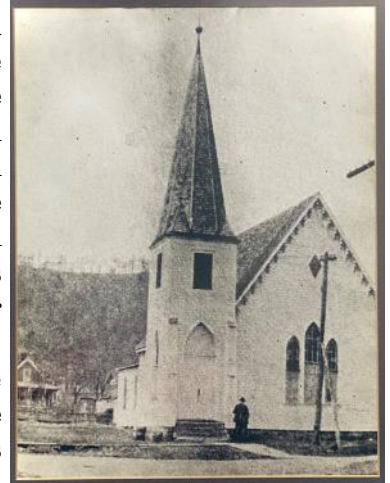

Our Beginnings—A History and Comment

FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH BY ANNE REYNOLDS BUCKNER

Early Beginnings of FCC 1888. excerpt *The Morehead News*, by Jack Ellis, April 3, 1998 [MSU Scholarworks](#)

In the years of 1884-1887 darkness was upon the land in Morehead. The flame of faith was flickering faintly. Morehead was a town terrorized by a bloody feud between factions and political parties. Innocent people were caught in the middle and were afraid to leave their homes at night. A fragile peace was negotiated between the feuding families in April 1885. It lasted less than a month before being broken. Both sides hired gunfighters with questionable reputations. The fighting escalated and many people were being killed or wounded. Governor Knott reluctantly ordered 100 fully armed troops to restore order. There would be peace in Morehead only as long as the troops remained. But as soon as they left the fighting would escalate. For the next two years the citizens of Morehead were afraid for their lives. Therefore church services were rare and when services were held they were held in the Courthouse. In June 1887 the flame of faith flickered. The Governor of Morehead refused to send troops a third time, the good citizens of Morehead decided to act. They armed themselves on June 22, 1887, after a bloody gun battle that resulted in four people being killed, peace came to Morehead. In 1888 a Presbyterian preacher by the name of Dr. Edward

[Rev. Dr. Edward Owings Guerrant](#) began to hold services in 1888 on the present site of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), known as the Union Church.

Owings Guerrant began to hold services in the courthouse in Morehead. Since there was no church building in town, he succeeded in convincing the Christian Church (DoC), Methodist and Presbyterians to build a “Union Church” located on the present site of the Christian Church. Each church would hold services at their scheduled time. Since church services were being held intermittently, this arrangement worked well. The Kentucky Conference of the Methodist Church in 1890 mentions that the Methodist have a mission church in Morehead and hold one-third interest there along with the Presbyterians and Disciples of Christ. Let it be said that Morehead was the cradle of ecumenism. In 1892 the Presbyterians moved out of Morehead, and in 1896 the Methodist built their own building. The Christian Church then acquired sole ownership of the Union Church. They quickly repaired and renovated this building and the congregation grew rapidly.

Edward Owings Guerrant was a Sharpsburg, KY native who became an author, medical doctor, and a renowned Presbyterian minister.

Outreach

CHANGES TO OUR PROGRAMS TO ADDRESS CURRENT NEEDS

We met with the Rowan County Schools Family Resource Youth Service Center (FRYSC) Directors to determine greatest needs of our families for this fall and winter. We also spoke with our contact for the elderly, getting input about their greatest needs this holiday season. The following items were discussed with the Outreach Committee members via e-meeting. The committee supports implementing these initiatives and making adjustments to our existing holiday programs.



Helping with Hoodies. Charles Graham, FRYSC Director for Rowan County High School, indicated a great need for hoodies for middle-school and high-school students. Typically, these students do not wear coats, regardless of how cold it is, but they will wear zipper hoodies. They are also very peer-aware and are often too embarrassed to wear “Walmart” or “Dollar Store” brand clothing. Our committee agreed to do a hoodie drive during the month of October. I have created a Sign-up Genius for this, to hopefully get us a variety of sizes for these students. The drive will run until October 31st. Shifting our Focus:

Families - As a result of the pandemic, families have received a great deal of assistance with regard to food. FRYSC directors suggested that we buy fewer food items, and perhaps more hygiene/household/cleaning items. Our committee agreed to omit some items from our food list and replace them with healthier foods (which tend to be more expensive and harder to purchase on a limited budget). We will add some household/hygiene items to the list to better meet their needs. The FRYSC directors are currently working on choosing the neediest families for us to help, and getting needs information from those families. Sign-ups will be posted for those items by the end of October.

The Elderly - Our contact for the elderly indicated a continued need for the items we have purchased in the past, but also added that these folks could greatly benefit from a Kroger gift card, which will help them purchase food in the winter. The elderly have not received pandemic assistance to the degree that families have, and so may need some extra help this winter. Our committee agreed to get a Kroger card for each of the ten elderly couples/individuals that we help this year. She requested that we add some inspirational/devotional reading materials for them as well. A sign-up genius will also be created for the Elderly Holiday Project by the end of October.

Thanksgiving Baskets - Our youth will once again shop for our Gateway Thanksgiving baskets. If you would like to make a monetary donation to support this project, please make a note on your FCC donation to indicate “Thanksgiving Baskets.” All monetary donations are greatly appreciated!



Dress for Success - A counselor at Pathways reached out to our church, requesting help for a client who has just completed six months of addiction recovery. She will be starting a new job soon as a peer counselor, and is in need of work-appropriate clothing. Members of the outreach committee combined efforts and were able to provide this young lady with work outfits to wear for several days.

Gateway Housewarming Baskets - November is our last month for Gateway housewarming baskets. This ministry will resume with fresh sign-ups in February, 2022. Thanks to everyone who has helped with this project. Paul Semisch let me know that the very day he picked up last month’s items, he was able to distribute those items to two transitioning families. Please know that your Gateway gifts have blessed many families this year!



People’s Clinic Lunches needed in November - We will need to provide two lunches in November for the 10-12 People’s Clinic Volunteers. Exact dates will be given to us sometime in October, but they are typically the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month. 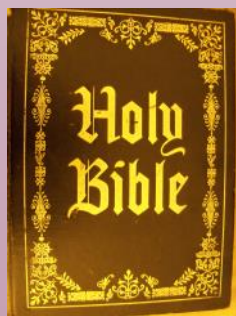
