

#### Spotlighting Backpack Project

For several years, FCC has supplemented the Rowan County Schools Backpack Project for snacks for children over the weekends. We provide a variety of five snacks each week—juice boxes, fresh

fruit: apples, bananas, or oranges—granola bars—cheese crackers—cheese sticks—carrot packets. (We provide fresh and healthy snacks.) This project is partially funded by the money we receive from Kroger when our members and friends use the Kroger cards. Last year we received \$937.46 from Kroger and our total cost for the school year was \$4,574.00.



As you can see we need to try to involve more of our congregation and friends in this. We work with two of the elementary schools and they pack approximately 70 backpacks each week.




