And today, as I write this, there is an emergency field hospital unit set up in the parking lot at St. Claire Regional Medical Center to process patients as the medical facility is straining to care for patients.

The Returning to Worship committee made the difficult decision to resume virtual worship services beginning on August 15. At the time it seemed we were alone in this assessment. Although we know many congregations in our area are continuing to meet in person, the ecumenical guidelines on safely gathering indoors for worship services recommend a more cautious approach. Our Beginnings—A History and Comment

First Christian Church by Anne Reynolds Buckner

Ida Withers Harrison, First Christian Church Member and Women's Rights Advocate.

Ida Withers Harrison is remembered for her services to Christian mission endeavors in addition to her work as a philanthropist and advocate for women's education, rights and suffrage. She is the daughter of William T. Withers and was an active

member of the Disciples of Christ. She served as vice president of the National Christian Women's Board of Missions, wrote a history of the board's work, edited a page in the Christian Century at a time when all other contributors were men, and she was appointed chairman of Kentucky Equal Rights Committee on church work in 1910. She was a gifted The Withers & Harrison family orator who was regularly invited to speak at various Social Hygiene functions. In 1910 she was recruited to serve on the Kentucky Equal Rights Association lecture bureau,


and in 1920 Harrison was listed as a member of the "oratorical heavy artillery" for the Speaker's Bureau of the Kentucky Democratic Campaign. Harrison was the recipient of a number of important awards. She was named honorary president for life of the Kentucky Federation of Women's Clubs. She became the first woman ever to receive an honorary Doctorate of Law from Transylvania University.




FCC Outreach News
